

Combined-Integrated Clinical and School Psychology Assistant/Associate Professor

THE COMBINED-INTEGRATED DOCTORAL PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT OF GRADUATE PSYCHOLOGY AT JAMES MADISON UNIVERSITY is seeking an outstanding clinician-researcher to join the core faculty of its innovative, APA-accredited C-I Program in Clinical and School Psychology in August 2008. This tenure-track position will be filled at either the Assistant or Associate level. Qualified candidates may be eligible for an endowed professorship, which would provide a salary supplement and other benefits. The successful applicant will possess a doctorate from an APA-accredited program in Clinical, Counseling, School, or C-I Psychology, be eligible for licensure in Virginia, and have a commitment to an integrative, scientific humanistic approach to the field and profession. Although the specific area of scholarly and teaching emphasis is open, preference may be given to candidates who demonstrate strong aptitude for scholarship and training in one or more of the following areas: research design (especially in small N and mixed methodologies); personality or neuropsychological assessment; and international and/or cross-cultural research, teaching, or service. Evidence of excellence in teaching/training from an integrative perspective as well as potential in grant development and leadership at the state, national, and international levels are particularly relevant for this position. *Responsibilities include:* teaching two doctoral-level courses each semester, supervision of practica, chairing dissertation committees, scholarship and service to the Department. The C-I Program emphasizes intensive, integrative training with high quality students who already possess at least a Master's degree. The Program is highly collegial and collaborative, actively self-reflective, and enjoys excellent administrative support.
